Therefore, be it resolved by the St. Bernard-Elmwood Place Board of Education, Ohio;

Section 1: That the Auditor and Treasurer of Hamilton County in accordance with Ohio Revised Code 321.34, be requested to draw and pay to the St. Bernard-Elmwood Place City School District upon the written request of Treasurer, to the County Auditor, funds due derived from taxes or other sources, payable to the County Treasurer to the account of the St. Bernard-Elmwood Place Schools, and lawfully applicable for purposes of the 2023 fiscal year.

Section 2: That the Treasurer of the St. Bernard-Elmwood Place City Schools shall forward to the County Auditor a certified copy of this resolution.

I. Adopt Temporary Appropriations for the 2022-2023 School Year

WHEREAS, it is desired to postpone the passage of the Annual Appropriations Resolution until an Amended Official Certificate of Estimated Resources for the year beginning July 1, 2022 is received from the County Budget Commission, and to pass a temporary resolution for meeting the ordinary expenses of this school district until the effective date of the Annual Appropriations Resolution, and

WHEREAS, Section 58.705.38 of the Ohio Revised Code provides that a temporary appropriations measure may be passed to meet ordinary expenses until not later than October 1 of the current fiscal year;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the St. Bernard-Elmwood Place City School District of Hamilton County that to provide for the current expenses and other expenditures of said Board for the period July 1, 2022 until the effective date of the Annual Appropriations Resolution for the fiscal year

ending June 30, 2023 the following sums be, and the same are, hereby set aside and appropriated for the several purposes for which expenditures are to be made for and during said periods as follows, vis

B. Approval of the Master Contract Between the St. Bernard-Elmwood Place Education Association and the St. Bernard-Elmwood Place Board of Education It is recommended that the Master Contract between the St. Bernard-Elmwood Place Education Association and the St. Bernard-Elmwood Place Board of Education be approved as presented.

C. Middle School Career Technical Education Waiver

St. Bernard-Elmwood Place City School District will not provide middle school career technical programming to 7th and 8th grade students during the 2022-2023 school year.

It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Board concerning or related to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an opening meeting of this Board, and all deliberations of this Board and any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were adopted in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all applicable requirements of the Ohio Revised Code.

D. Resolution Authorizing Superintendent to Make Determination of Impracticability WHEREAS, the St. Bernard-Elmwood Place City School District Board of Education (the "Board") is empowered by the Ohio Revised Code to declare student transportation impractical; and

WHEREAS, for the purpose of efficient and good management of the schools and pursuant to R.C. 3327.01, the Board wishes to assign to the Superintendent the ability to make determinations that student transportation is impractical, which will be formalized by the Board at a meeting following such determinations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE St. Bernard-Elmwood Place City School District, as follows:

Section 1

After considering individual data relevant to each particular situation and analyzing the factors outlined in R.C. 3327.02, the Superintendent is authorized to determine that transporting a student(s) is/are impractical. Such determinations shall be subject to formalization at the next following meeting of the Board.

Section 2

IT IS FOUND AND DETERMINED that all formal actions of this Board concerning or related to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Board, and all deliberations of this Board and any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were adopted in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all applicable requirements of the Ohio Revised Code.

E. Resolution Declaring Transportation Impractical RESOLUTION DECLARING TRANPORTATION IMPRACTICAL

WHEREAS, the Superintendent for the St. Bernard-Elmwood Place City School District has received a request for transportation for students enrolled in the District, a nonpublic or community school, or the joint vocational school; and

WHEREAS, the Superintendent has determined the listed students eligible but impractical to transport by public conveyance; and

WHEREAS, the St. Bernard-Elmwood Place City School District Board of Education (hereafter the "Board") has carefully considered transportation options for the eligible students listed in Exhibit A under Ohio Revised Code Section 3327.01; and

WHEREAS, for each of the students listed, the Board has considered the following factors as enumerated in R.C. §3327.02:

- 1) The time and distance required to provide the transportation;
- 2) The number of pupils to be transported;
- 3) The cost of providing transportation in terms of equipment, maintenance, personnel and administration;
- 4) Whether similar or equivalent service is provided to other pupils eligible for transportation;
- 5) Whether and to what extent the additional service unavoidably disrupts current transportation schedules; and
- 6) Whether other reimbursable types of transportation are available.

WHEREAS, the option of offering payment in lieu of transportation is provided by the Ohio Revised Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the St. Bernard-Elmwood Place City School District Board of Education as follows:

Section 1

After fully and carefully considering each of the factors listed above, the Board hereby affirms the determination that it is impractical to transport the students listed in Exhibit A for the 2022-2023 school year, and further hereby offers the parent(s)/guardian(s) payment in lieu of transportation. This decision was reached after considering the factors enumerated in R.C. §3327.02. Required reports will be made as directed by the Ohio Department of Education.

Section 2

The Board of Education finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the adoption of this resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Board of Education, and that all deliberations of this Board of Education and of its committees, if any, which resulted in formal action, were taken in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with applicable legal requirements, including Ohio Revised Code Section 121.22.

Section 3

This resolution shall be in full force and effect from and immediately after its adoption and shall supersede any prior resolution or act of this Board of Education that may be inconsistent or duplicative with the provisions of this resolution.
